



The Gordon Parks Foundation Award is given to outstanding individuals whose contributions to the arts reflect four principles that Gordon demonstrated throughout his life: courage, vision, compassion and dignity.



RUSSELL SIMMONS

Russell Simmons has been the master of the hip-hop phenomenon since its inception in the late 1970's. In 1994, along with his partner Rick Rubin, Russell created the legendary Def Jam Recordings, catapulting the cultural revolution that is hip-hop as we know it today. His fashion empire Phat Farm defined hip-hop clothing and others followed. His film and television production company has had several successful series including MTV's Run's House, HBO's The Def Comedy Jam and Russell Simmons' Presents Def Poetry which led him to Broadway with Russell Simmons' Def Poetry Jam on Broadway. Russell's interests extend far beyond the business world and his work as an activist has been significant. In 1995, along with his brothers

Danny and Joseph "Rev Run" Simmons, Russell founded Rush Philanthropic Arts Foundation, dedicated to providing disadvantaged youth with exposure and access to the arts, and offering exhibition opportunities to underrepresented artists and artists of color. In 2001 he founded the Hip-Hop Summit Action Network to harness the cultural relevance of hip-hop music as a catalyst for education advocacy and other societal concerns fundamental to the well-being of at-risk youth throughout the United States. His latest business venture is Global Grind, the premier on-line destination for the global hip-hop community.



LIYA KEBEDE

Ethiopian fashion model and advocate for maternal, newborn and child health, Liya Kebede is a supermodel and mother who was featured on the cover of American *Vogue* for the second time in May 2005, with the headline "Cover Model With A Cause." Her Liya Kebede Foundation helps reduce mother and child mortality though work with governmental and non-governmental organizations. The Foundation aims to increase awareness and visibility of cost-effective, evidence-based interventions which are extremely effective in improving the health and survival of mothers and children. Liya's children's clothing line, Lemlem, features products hand-woven in Ethiopia that are intended to help build the Ethiopian manufacturing


industry, inspire economic independence, and preserve the art of weaving. She will be seen next starring in the independent film *Desert Flower*, an adaptation of Waris Dirie's best-selling autobiography.



ISABEL TOLEDO

Cuban born Isabel Toledo attended both the Fashion Institute of Technology and Parsons School of Design, but she credits an internship with Diana Vreeland at the Metropolitan Museum of Art with her real training. She has been described as a "cult figure" by the New York Times, one of the "100 Designers that Count" by Women's Wear Daily, and Vogue called her "an important raw talent." In 1998, together with her husband Ruben Toledo, Isabel was the subject of an exhibition at the Museum of the Fashion Institute of Technology which chronicled their seventeen years of collaboration in design and art. This exhibition, entitled Toledo-Toledo: A Marriage of Art and Fashion, has since traveled around the world. In 2005, Isabel

and Ruben Toledo were the recipients of the Cooper Hewitt National Design Award for Fashion and in 2006 they were awarded a Fashion Visionary Award by FGI, an organization founded by Eleanor Roosevelt to promote design awareness in the United States. Isabel has been on the International Best Dressed List twice and a 25 year retrospective exhibition and catalog of her fashion designs will be published this year by Yale University Press.



BRUCE WEBER

Bruce Weber became a preeminent photographer of the fashion industry in the 1980's and continues to be one of its most popular and influential photographers. Working for Ralph Lauren, Calvin Klein, Karl Lagerfeld, Gianni Versace—and more recently, Abercrombie & Fitch—Weber pioneered a nostalgic, boy-next-door style that redefined the industry. He has also earned acclaim for his filmmaking, including *Broken Noses* (1987), a documentary about boxer and Olympic hopeful Andy Minsker; *Let's Get Lost* (1989), a documentary on jazz trumpeter Chet Baker, which was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Feature Documentary; and *Chop Suey Club* (2001), a feature on wrestler Peter Johnson. His most recent

documentary, A Letter to True, an anti-war film, opened at the Berlin Film Festival and showed as an official selection at the Tribeca, Toronto, and Edinburgh Film Festivals in 2004. More than fifteen books of Weber's work have been published including the just-released Cartier I Love You. His photographs are in the permanent collections of the Victoria and Albert Museum in London and the Museum of Modern Art in Paris. Weber has received a Clio Award for Recognition in Apparel (1986); the International Documentary Association Award for both Broken Noses (1986) and Let's Get Lost (1987); an ICP Infinity Award for Applied Photography (1993); and the 1st Annual Alfred Eisenstadt Award for portrait photography from Life Magazine (1998).

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ANDRÉ LEON TALLEY

André Leon Talley is *Vogue's* Editor-at-Large, regularly delivering his "Life with André" column, as well as taking charge of many fashion and celebrity projects for the magazine. He was hired as *Vogue's* Fashion News Director in 1983 and became Creative Director from 1988 to 1995. After living in Paris for several years, he returned to *Vogue* in 1998 to take on his current role. André is the author of two books: *ALT: a Memoir*, and *ALT 365+*. He is a member of the Board of the Savannah College of Art and Design where a lifetime achievement award has been named for him. He is also the 2003 recipient of the Council of Fashion Designers of America (CFDA) Eugenia Sheppard Award for Excellence in Fashion Journalism.





The Nikon/Gordon Parks Scholarship was established in 2009 with a \$25,000 donation from Nikon, Inc. to create an endowment through which annual scholarships will be awarded to cover nearly half of the annual tuition for a New York State student at Purchase College/SUNY in the School of Art + Design. Each year, the grant will be given to a photography student whose work reflects the passion and vision and humanity of Gordon Parks. The very first recipient is a Bachelor of Fine Arts candidate, majoring in photography. Her enthusiasm, her dedication to her art and her ability to look at the world in unique new ways made her an obvious choice to the SUNY faculty who made the final selection. The first recipient of the Nikon/Gordon Parks Scholarship is Chiara Marinai.



CHIARA MARINAI

Chiara Marinai is a sophomore at SUNY Purchase College. Although she was born and raised in New York City, her father is from Florence, Italy and her mother is from Reykjavik, Iceland. She attended a very small Italian school from kindergarten through twelfth grade, graduating in a class of only six students. She was given her first manual camera in tenth grade, a hand-me-down from her great aunt, and she became fascinated with what she could achieve with film. Soon after, she took a black and white photography class at the International Center of Photography, and has been passionate about the medium ever since.

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HUGH HILDESLEY

Born in Cambridge, England, Hugh Hildesley joined Sotheby's in 1961 as an apprentice porter in the Old Masters Painting Division. In 1965 he moved to New York as the head of Sotheby's Old Masters Painting Division. He was ordained as an Episcopal priest in 1976, but remained at Sotheby's. He has written three books—Sotheby's Guide to Buying and Selling at Auction in 1983, Journeying with Julian in 1993, and The Complete Guide to Buying and Selling at Auction in 1997. In 1995 Hugh was named Sotheby's Executive Vice President for North and South America. He is an accomplished auctioneer, lecturer, and contributor to journals on all aspects of the auction business.





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
