Unresponsive upon his birth in 1912, Gordon Parks' new life was saved by a doctor who—taking a chance—placed him in a bowl of ice water. The shock of this impromptu baptism started his heart and began an extraordinary journey. In the nine decades that followed that fateful moment, this great artist's heart would change the world. It would define his photography, his writing and music, and his lifelong fight against injustice. A century later, we can still feel its powerful beat.

We are here to honor three individuals whose work has changed the landscape of film, photography and music. Each has excelled in a field Gordon cared deeply about; each shares his commitment to making the world a better place.



Also tonight, we honor the promise of young artists. We proudly present this year's HBO/ Gordon Parks Scholarship and the Nikon/Gordon Parks Scholarship. And working with two important organizations dedicated to the advancement of the arts—Rush Philanthropic and YoungArts—we will award the first two Gordon Parks Centennial Scholarships to a pair of talented recipients.

We are proud this evening to launch a rich program of events in the city of New York celebrating the centennial of Gordon's birth.

I hope all of you will get a chance this summer to visit the International Center of Photography. There, in the museum's windows at 43rd Street and the Avenue of the Americas, you will see Gordon Parks: 100 Years—a public art project created by Dr. Maurice Berger. In September, the Howard Greenberg Gallery will install an exhibition of Gordon's photographs, curated by acclaimed artist Glenn Ligon. That same month, we celebrate the publication of Gordon Parks: Collected Works, a five-volume survey of an extraordinary career in photography—the most comprehensive book ever published on the subject, with essays by Berger, Henry Louis Gates, Jr., Deborah Willis, Barbara Baker Burrows and Paul Roth. The publication, from esteemed German art publisher Steidl Verlag, will be formally launched with a panel discussion in late September, including Dr. Gates and others, at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Finally, in November, legendary curator Thelma Golden installs her much-anticipated show of Gordon's groundbreaking 1968 documentary photographs of the Fontenelle family, at Harlem's Studio Museum. On behalf of the Board of Directors, our co-chairs Karl Lagerfeld and Gerhard Steidl and our staff at Purchase College, I thank you all for honoring Gordon Parks with us tonight.

Anderson Cooper master of ceremonies

Anderson Cooper is the anchor of CNN's Anderson Cooper 360°, a nightly newscast that goes beyond the headlines – keeping politicians and policy makers honest and in-



depth reporting representing all points of view. Cooper has covered nearly all-major news events around the world, often reporting from the scene. During most of 2007 and 2008, Cooper traveled around the world for *Planet in Peril*, a high definition documentary about issues threatening the planet, its inhabitants and its natural resources.

Cooper teamed up for a multi-platform initiative with Cartoon Network and *Time Inc.* again this year and moderated a second town hall aimed to take a stand to help stop the alarming bullying crisis. He has also played a pivotal role in CNN's political coverage and has anchored from conventions and moderated several presidential debates. This past October Cooper moderated CNN's Republican debate from Las Vegas.

In addition to Anderson Cooper 360°, Cooper is the host and executive producer of "Anderson," the nationally syndicated, daily one-hour daytime talk show. Cooper also provides reports for CBS's 60 Minutes. Dispatches from the Edge, Cooper's memoirs about covering the South Asia tsunami, Hurricane Katrina and other news events, topped the New York Times Bestsellers List and other bestseller charts.

Before joining CNN, Cooper was an ABC News correspondent and host of the network's reality program, *The Mole*. Cooper anchored ABC's live, interactive news and interview program, World News Now, as well as providing reports for World News Tonight, 20/20 and 20/20 Downtown. Previously, he was a New York-based correspondent for ABC News, reporting primarily for World News Saturday/Sunday. Cooper joined ABC from Channel One News, where he served as chief international correspondent.

IRVIN MAYFIELD, 34, is a Grammy and Billboard Award-winning artist with 15 albums to his credit. Mayfield is the founding Artistic Director of the New Orleans Jazz Orchestra and currently serves as Artistic Director of Jazz at the Minnesota Orchestra. He is currently a professor at the University of New Orleans, where he also serves as Director of the New Orleans Jazz Institute. Mayfield was nominated to the National Council on the Arts by President George W. Bush and was subsequently appointed to the post by President Barack Obama in 2010.

Mayfield also received The Chancellor's Award from the University of New Orleans (the highest ranking award given to a professor) in 2010 and was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from Dillard University in 2011. A passionate advocate for New Orleans and for the arts, Mayfield is Chairman of the Board for the



New Orleans Public Library Foundation and for the Soledad O'Brien & Brad Raymond Foundation. He also serves on the boards of Citizens United for Economic Equity, Louisiana State University's Department of Psychiatry and Health Science, the New Orleans Police and Justice Foundation, Tulane University's School of Architecture, Unity of New Orleans and the Youth Rescue Initiative.

RICHARD PLEPLER HONOREE

Richard Plepler was named co-president of HBO in June 2007 where he oversees all original programming for both the HBO and Cinemax pay-TV networks. In partnership with HBO's President of Programing Michael Lombardo, Plepler has greenlit some of HBO's most acclaimed and successful series including True Blood, Boardwalk Empire and Game of Thrones, which rank among the top programs in the network's history. Additional award-winning programs include the miniseries Mildred Pierce and Generation Kill; HBO Films Too Big To Fail, Temple Grandin, Taking Chance,



Grey Gardens and You Don't Know Jack. He also shepherded Cinemax's first foray into primetime originals with the popular action series Strikeback.

Plepler is a member of both the Council on Foreign Relations and The Trilateral Commission. He is also a member of the Board of Trustees for the Asia Society and the New York Public Library; serves on the board of the Center for National Interest, a foreign policy think tank based in Washington D.C.; and is on the National Advisory Board of the W.E.B. DuBois Institute for African and African American Research at Harvard University.

He received his BA in Government from Franklin and Marshall College in 1981 and then joined the staff of Senator Christopher Dodd from 1981-1984. Plepler later founded RLP, Inc., his own consultancy specializing in strategic communication and production from 1985-1992. He joined HBO in 1992 as senior vice president, Corporate Communications, promoted to executive vice president, Corporate Communications, in 1997, and named executive vice president, HBO, in 2002. 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Annie Leibovitz

Annie Leibovitz's distinguished body of work encompasses some of the most well-known portraits of our time. She began her career as a photojournalist for *Rolling Stone* in 1970, while she was still a student at the San Francisco Art Institute. Her pictures have appeared regularly on magazine covers ever since.

Leibovitz became *Rolling Stone*'s chief photographer in 1973. By the time she left the magazine, ten years later, she had shot one hundred and forty-two covers and published photo essays on scores of stories, including



her memorable accounts of the resignation of Richard Nixon and of the 1975 Rolling Stones tour. In 1983 she joined the staff of *Vanity Fair* and was established as the foremost rock music photographer and an astute documentarian of the social landscape. At *Vanity Fair*, and later at *Vogue*, her work with actors, directors, writers, musicians, athletes, and political and business figures, as well as her fashion photographs, expanded her collective portrait of contemporary life. She has also created several influential advertising campaigns, including her award-winning portraits for American Express and the Gap.

Leibovitz has published several books and has exhibited widely, including at the National Portrait Gallery and the Corcoran Gallery in Washington, D.C.; the International Center of Photography in New York; the Brooklyn Museum; the Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam; the Maison Européenne de la Photographie in Paris; and the National Portrait Gallery in London.

In 2006 Leibovitz was decorated a Commandeur in the Ordre des Arts et des Lettres by the French government. The previous year, in a compilation of the forty top magazine covers of the past forty years by the American Society of Magazine Editors (ASME), she held the top two spots (#1 for the photograph of John Lennon and Yoko Ono taken for *Rolling Stone* the day Lennon was shot, and #2 for the pregnant Demi Moore in *Vanity Fair*). In 2009, she received the International Center of Photography's Lifetime Achievement Award, ASME's first Creative Excellence Award, and the Centenary Medal of the Royal Photographic Society in London. Leibovitz has been designated a Living Legend by the Library of Congress. She lives in New York with her three children, Sarah, Susan, and Samuelle.

Alicia Keys

Alicia Keys can be described as a modern-day Renaissance woman. She is a 14-time Grammy® Award-winning singer/songwriter/producer, an accomplished actress, a New York Times best-selling author, an entrepreneur and a powerful force in the world of philanthropy and in the global fight against HIV and AIDS. Since the 2001 release of her monumental debut album, songs in A minor, Keys has built an unparalleled repertoire of hits and accomplishments with more than 30 million albums sold worldwide. Keys recently celebrated the 10th



Anniversary of songs in A minor with the release of a Deluxe and Collector's Edition of the album as well as special concert performances "Piano & I: A One Night Only Event with Alicia Keys."

Keys is currently working on her fifth studio album which will be released this fall. In addition to her stellar achievements in the music world, Keys has had buzz worthy performances in the films, *Smokin' Aces'*(2007), *The Nanny Diaries* (2007) and *The Secret Life of Bees* (2008). Last year, Keys made her directorial debut for Lifetime's *Five* which was comprised of five interconnected short films starring Rosario Dawson as well as Tracee Ellis Ross, Jennifer Lewis, Jeffrey Tambor and Jeanne Tripplehorn. *Five* explored the impact of breast cancer on people's lives and relationships, with a focus on how women look at themselves as they fight the disease and search for a cure.

Keys also made her producorial debut in 2011 with Lydia R. Diamond's play *Stick Fly* for the Cort Theater which Keys also composed the original music for. Keys' first published work, *Tears for Water:* Songbook of *Poems & Lyrics by Alicia Keys*, made her a *New York Times* Bestselling author. A devoted and influential philanthropist, Keys co-founded Keep a Child Alive (KCA), and serves as Global Ambassador for the non-profit organization dedicated to providing life-saving, anti-retroviral treatment and resources to children and their families with HIV/AIDS in Africa and most recently, India.

ABOUT THE NIKON GORDON PARKS PHOTOGRAPHY SCHOLARSHIP



The Nikon Gordon Parks Scholarship was established in 2009 with a \$25,000 donation from Nikon, Inc. to create an endowment through which annual scholarships will be awarded to cover nearly half of the annual tuition for a New York State student at Purchase College/SUNY in the School of Art + Design. Each year the grant will be given to a photography student whose work reflects the passion, vision and humanity of Gordon Parks.

REBECCA IASILLO is a senior photography major at SUNY Purchase College. Raised in upstate New York, Rebecca has acquired a keen sense of awareness and appreciation for the suburban landscape and the dynamics inherent within domesticity. Her photographic work is a critique of this suburban culture. Her senior thesis exhibition titled "cul de sac," explores the notion of the family as possessing a contained space, a community circling around itself with the same potency as this feature of the suburban landscape. Motivated by her past, Rebecca attempts to create a strange sense of irony in



her constructed scenes, encouraging a certain awe-instilling reflection onto an otherwise mundane depiction of the everyday.

ABOUT THE HBO GORDON PARKS FILM SCHOLARSHIP



This Scholarship recognizes new talent that has come out of the Ghetto Film School in the Bronx, New York where their mission is to educate, develop and celebrate the next generation of great American storytellers.

JARED RAY was born and raised in The Bronx, New York and is a graduate of St. Raymond's Elementary school.He was 12 years old when he created his first story, which was a comic book drawn in stick figure form. In his junior year of high school, Jared made the decision to pursue a career as a filmmaker. Jared joined the Ghetto Film School in the summer of 2010. His 6-mlnute short film, "In Darkness," screened at Lincoln Center in September 2010 and won one of three Lincoln Center Grand Jury Prizes. In January 2011, Jared was one of 7 students picked to attend the Sundance Film Festival in Park City, Utah, and got



to fully experience all of the festivities surrounding it. His thesis script, "Prank," was chosen Ghetto Film School's 2011 Thesis Project, and was shot in Shanghai, China. Jared currently attends college at SUNY-Purchase's highly regarded film conservatory, from where he will graduate in 2015. "Prank" debuted at the HBO Theater last month to a full audience.

The Gordon Parks Centennial Scholarship is being awarded this year to two individuals at not-for-profit arts organizations who are continuing the artistic traditions that Gordon Parks valued. Widely known as the most important African American photographer of the twentieth century, Parks combined his artistic style with a commitment to humanitarianism. For more than half a century, he exposed the face of American poverty with sympathy and dignity, often concentrating on the plight of African Americans and immigrants. A pivotal figure in the history civil rights in America, as well as the global human rights movement, Parks used his artistic skill to champion social change. The Gordon Parks Centennial Scholarship has been created to honor the life and legacy of Parks on the centennial of his birth, and to help advance the accomplishments of young artists today.

While singing with these ensembles, Nia has sung with Sir Elton John, Bette Midler, and Billy Joel to name a few. She has also appeared in choruses under the



batons of Michael Tilson Thomas, Lorin Maazel, Marin Alsop, and Renee Clausen. Nia has additionally appeared in competitions and concert series in Dominican Republic and Austria. Nia hopes to travel to China in July of 2012 for the World Choral Summit with the Young People's Chorus of NYC. Recently, Nia was selected as a Young Arts Finalist in Jazz Voice by the National Foundation for the Advancement of the Arts in January 2012.

YOUNGARTS is the core program of the National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts (NFAA), founded in 1981 by businessman and visionary, the late Ted Arison, who also founded Carnival Cruise Lines, and his wife Lin. YoungArts winners experience life-changing workshops and master classes with such renowned Legacy Masters as Mikhail Baryshnikov, Martin Scorsese and Quincy Jones, as well as major performance opportunities and access to significant scholarships during YoungArts Weeks held in Miami, New York, Washington DC, and elsewhere. Additionally, YoungArts serves as the exclusive nominating agency for the U.S. Presidential Scholars in the Arts, one of the country's highest honors for young artists. The YoungArts program has honored more than 16,000 young artists with more than \$6 million in monetary awards and has facilitated in excess of \$100 million in college scholarship opportunities. Alumni go on to become leading professionals in their fields and include Emmy-nominated actress Vanessa Williams, four-time Tony Award nominee Raúl Esparza, star of HBO's Entourage Adrian Grenier, recording artists Nicki Minaj, Executive Director of the American Ballet Theatre Rachel Moore, Academy Award nominated actresses Viola Davis and Kerry Washington, and internationally acclaimed multimedia artist Doug Aitken.

SHALISA CHANG was born and raised in Brooklyn and attended Lyons Community School (high school) in Bushwick, where she was introduced to the Rush Gallery in the School program. Shalisa instantly took to being a Rush Teen and remained highly involved throughout her high school career. While at Lyons, Shalisa also attended Long Island University's Summer Bridge Project where the curriculum involved exploring significant locations in Brooklyn and creating one's own interpretation through words and images. Shalisa says "Rush has had a major impact on my future and current goals. It is absolutely a privilege to work with a range



of teaching artists and experiment with various mediums. The experience of being a Rush Kid or Rush Teen is very significant to me because it isn't just the art making process alone but also lifelong skills being taught during each class, preparing us for the real world. I have been a part of the Rush Community for five years now, since I was a freshman in high school. After graduation I was offered the opportunity to intern with Rush, so although I still had the option to make art I also had the chance to help other students, playing a leadership role." Nineteen year-old Shalisa Chang has three siblings including her younger brother Albert who is following in her footsteps as a Rush Kid. Shalisa has just finished her freshman year at Wells College where she majors in Visual Arts.

RUSH EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Offered in 15 sessions twice a year on Saturday mornings, after school, and over the summer, Rush Kids/Teens serves 100+ students every year, youth who are eager to explore new forms of creativity and self-expression, to expand their understanding of the contemporary art and culture that surrounds them, and develop new ideas and ways of thinking about their world. The program is taught in the Rush Galleries, where the students experience exhibitions of professional artists' work. It also incorporates extensive field trips to working artists studios and other contemporary art exhibitions in venues throughout the city. Students learn about the concepts, themes and the formal components and media of the art, discuss how the artists relate their work to larger social and cultural issues, and, in intensive, handson workshops, and create their own artwork based on these learning experiences. Rush programs are taught by a rotating roster of teaching artists: 27 working professional artists and experienced teachers of diverse backgrounds. Each teaches workshops based in their own studio practice, exposing the students to a wide range of cultural viewpoints, media, themes and teaching styles.

Founded in 1995 by brothers Russell, Danny and Joseph "Rev. Run" Simmons, Rush Philanthropic Arts Foundation is a 501 c3 organization dedicated to providing public school students with invaluable arts education experiences, and empowering emerging artists through exhibition opportunities. Rush operates two galleries (Corridor Gallery in Clinton Hill, Brooklyn and Rush Arts Gallery in Chelsea), and directly serves over 2,400 students through its education programs (Rush Gallery in the School, Rush Education Exchange, and Rush Kids/Teens).

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Born in Cambridge, England, Hugh Hildesley joined Sotheby's in 1961 as an apprentice porter in the Old Masters Painting Division. In 1965 he moved to

This five-volume collection, co-published by Steidl and the Gordon Parks Foundation, surveys five decades of Gordon Parks photography. It is the most extensive publication to document his legendary career. Widely recognized as the most important and influential African-American photographer of the twentieth century, Parks combined a unique documentary and artistic style with a profound commitment to social justice.
